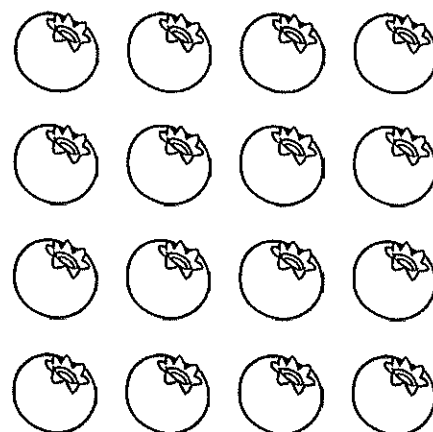
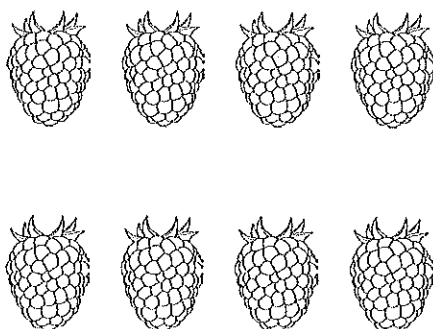
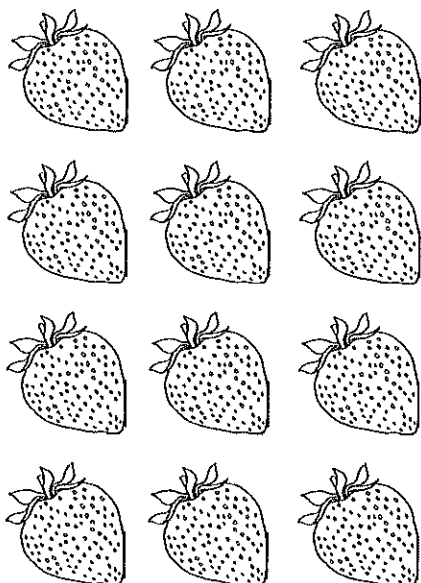
Summer Fruits Fractions

For each group of summer fruits, colour in $\frac{1}{2}$.





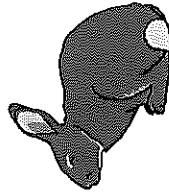
Garden Food Chain

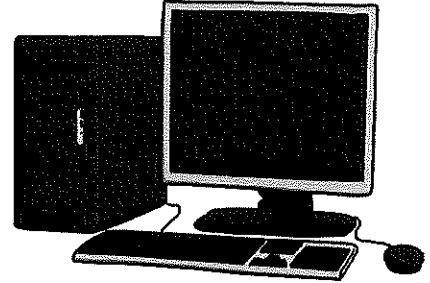




Word Problems

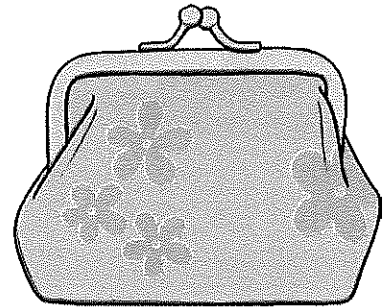
1. Joe and Sam are playing a computer game. Joe scores 45 points and Sam scores 32 points. How many points do they score altogether?
