



## Heelands School Pupil Premium Report 2016-17

Our allocation for 2016-17 was £36,960 plus £7,227 brought forward.

This was funding for 28 eligible PP pupils, which is 21% of the school population and of these only three were in year 2. The Year 2 children started school when universal free school meals were introduced and many parents did not understand the need to apply for pupil premium even though many would have been eligible. We've since had to work extremely hard to explain the Pupil Premium system to parents and although we offer incentives (a free school fleece, free trips and clubs) to encourage application, we still feel our numbers are not correct.

The lack of take-up means that we have many disadvantaged families who do not claim their entitlement and governors feel strongly that all of our financially disadvantaged children should be supported in order to achieve their potential and enjoy the same experiences as their peers. We know our families extremely well and the good relationships that we have with our parents enable us to identify need.

The highlighted blocks show areas where our PP children have performed better than their peers, significantly better than PP children nationally and better than all children nationally in achieving GLD and the Year 2 phonic re-check. National data for KS1 SATs below Expected is not available, so the figures included in the grid in the national WT columns for reading, writing and maths will also include those pupils working at PKF or BLW. None of our PP pupils were below WT.
