



## Heelands School Pupil Premium Report 2017-18

Our allocation for 2017-18 was £26,400.

This included funding for 23 eligible PP pupils, which is 16% of the school population and, of these, 11 were in the Year 2 cohort of 48 pupils, 6 in year 1 and 6 in FS.

Despite continuing to offer incentives of a free school fleece, free school trips and free after school clubs to encourage application, we remain convinced that our Pupil Premium numbers are not correct. The lack of parental take-up does mean that we have many disadvantaged families who are unable to or choose not to claim their entitlement and governors feel strongly that all of our financially disadvantaged children should be supported in order to achieve their potential and enjoy the same experiences as their peers. We know our families extremely well and the good relationships that we have with parents make identifying need, wherever that may be, much easier.

### In 2017/18 our Pupil Premium allocation was spent on:
